In July 2003 a group of experts chaired by André Sapir and appointed by Romano Prodi has delivered a new important report: 'An Agenda for a growing Europe: making the EU economic system deliver' that has ignited a wide debate. The broad objective of the report was «to review the system of EU economic policies and to propose a strategy for delivering faster growth together with stability». The Milan Workshop will contribute to this debate through an in-depth discussion of some key issues and policy reform proposals.

Several aspects of the European Constitution may have economic consequences, if this text is adopted by the UE Member States. The workshop offers an opportunity for economists, political scientists and experts in institutional design to discuss the economic reasoning and potential impact of the Constitution. These issues go far beyond the Union exclusive powers on monetary, trade and custom policy and de facto include some of the shared competences sectors (particularly internal market, agricolture, transport, energy social policy, cohesion, environment, consumers' protection, health. R&D, external aid). Four questions arise: a) is the governance design supportive of these wide ambitions? b) is there a lack of democracy and effectiveness in the monetary and financial integration institutions? c) are the EU economic policy institutions appropriate in terms of a common cohesion and growth agenda? d) is the sharing of competences well designed or is there a risk of conflict among EU and national governments?

The workshop aims to review methods of project appraisal and to establish new ideas for an incentive framework in evaluation and planning. The workshop builds on the approach of the EC sponsored "Guide of Cost-Benefit Analysis of Investment Projects" (2003) and on a new research by a team lead by Professor Massimo Florio.

THE TOPICS FOR DISCUSSION

Over two decades, the EU Structural Funds and the Cohesion Fund have co-financed through grants a very large number of projects in the Member States. These projects include mainly railways, roads, ports and airports, water distribution and treatment, solid waste management, but also manufacturing plants, science parks, museums, and others. Other sources of EU finance include grants under the Trans-European Networks in transport and energy, and loans by the European Investment Bank (EIB), or by the Bank for Reconstruction and Development (EBRD).

In 2007-2013 the EU Funds will contribute to the infrastructure plans of 27 countries, including ten new members (mostly former transition economies) and two new candidates to accession (Romania and Bulgaria). In this multi-government setting social cost-benefit analysis should be combined with an effective incentive structure for planning and evaluation. The Workshop will discuss evaluation experiences and key-parameters for project appraisal in the EU, and the planning process with multiple levels of government.

In recent years, the reform of services of general economic interest has played a central role in the debate on the European model of society. The objective of the workshop is to discuss empirical approaches to the welfare analysis of privatisation and liberalisation of selected services in the EU. The focus is on the subjective and objective impact of reforms on consumers' welfare.

THE TOPICS FOR DISCUSSION

Wide access, fair prices, high quality of public services are an essential ingredient of the European model of society. Efficiency, non-discrimination, and social affordability in SGI provision are also important for a smooth functioning of the Single Market. The empirical evidence on the welfare impact of reforms across EU countries is, however, still fragmentary and difficult to compare. The dissatisfaction of part of the public opinion with some privatisation and liberalisation policies of some SGI deserves the attention of policy makers and of social scientists. A research unit in the Department of Economics, Business, and Statistics, University of Milan, lead by Professor Massimo Florio, is working on the empirics of subjective and objective consumers' welfare changes related to utility reforms in particularly electricity, Europe, in gas and telecommunications. The project is supported by the EU, 6th Framework Programme, under the network 'Understanding Privatisation Policy: Political Economy and Welfare Effects' lead by FEEM*. A parallel project is supported by the Italian Ministry of University (PRIN, Universities of Milan, Pavia, and Bologna). The workshop will offer the opportunity to discuss preliminary findings of the Milan project and to exchange views with a select group of invited experts from different European research centres.

THE OBJECTIVE

The workshop will discuss the results of recent researches on industrial districts in Italy and in other countries and their policies implication.

THE TOPICS FOR DISCUSSION

Market opening and international fragmentation of production processes in the last two decades have started to reshape the traditional industrial districts in Europe and elsewhere. The Marshallian definition of an industrial district focused on "the concentration of specialized industries in particular localities" and on the close and creative interconnection between suppliers and buyers based on shared values and norms. The new global firm, however, relies on a wider network of distant suppliers, partners, distributors. production and internationalized firm tends to shape a new type of cluster, where geographical proximity seems to be less important. Some researchers, however, re-stated the idea that clusters are based on interconnections of local companies, suppliers, institutions, trade associations. Under a different view, industrial clusters are networks of productive agents that share knowledge, information, values and implicit or explicit norms, in a multi-level and multi-local dimension. Thus, are industrial districts evolving in de-localized networks?

To policy makers it is crucial to understand the potential trade-off between measures aimed at strengthening local development and other measures aimed at encouraging firms' internationalization, including de-localization of some production processes. It is also important to understand possible complementarities between the two types of policies under certain circumstances.

Their reform should be seen as a viable alternative to privatization, when divestiture of public ownership is not desirable or possible.

The traditional Big Science model has a top-down approach; it is typically linked to military and national ambitions and characterized by secrecy and restricted access to methods and data. In contrast, the new Research Infrastructure (RI) paradigm of science production, exemplified by the "Geneva model" of CERN, or the Human Genome Project, has a bottom up approach; it involves an international coalition of funders, it is accessible by multiple users and adopts an open science approach. In Europe there are around three hundred major RIs supported by international coalitions and perhaps one thousand significant ones mostly

funded by national governments, often with some support from the EU. Several hundred research infrastructures are operated or designed globally, including in developing economies, such as the Square Kilometer Array (SKA) in South Africa, or the Circular Electron positron Collider (CEPC) in China.

What is the social value of public investment in large scale science? How can we understand the new trends in the organization of knowledge production as a public good? What are the implications for economic growth and social justice?

Some of these issues are discussed in recent books such as Florio (2019), Gruber and Johnson (2019), Mazzucato, 2018.

This is an open call for papers for a special issue of the Annals of Public and Cooperative Economics on these questions.

The journal aims at publishing high-quality papers about how large-scale scientific projects (including particularly research infrastructures, technology hubs, research clusters, and other knowledge-intensive organizations) sustain growth, welfare, and social justice. We are interested in contributions based on different approaches, case studies and policy implications.

A non-exhaustive list of topics includes the following ones:

- Case studies of broad (global, national, local) impact of large-scale scientific projects
- · Understanding the impact of scientific projects on growth, welfare and social justice
- Social cost-benefit analysis and other quantitative methods of impact assessment
- The cultural impact of science projects, including through social and traditional media
- Citizens attitudes and engagement on science
- · The socio-economic impact of space science and technology, such as Earth Observation
- Public procurement for innovation in such fields as physics, astronomy, space science, and other capital-intensive
 demains.
- · Science and technology missions for public enterprises, development banks and other economic players
- Technological learning from research infrastructures, spin-offs, venture capital
- Intellectual property and government funded large scientific projects
- Big data and Big science: challenges and opportunities
- Science policy issues related to large-scale projects, mission-oriented policies and organizations


